District Background

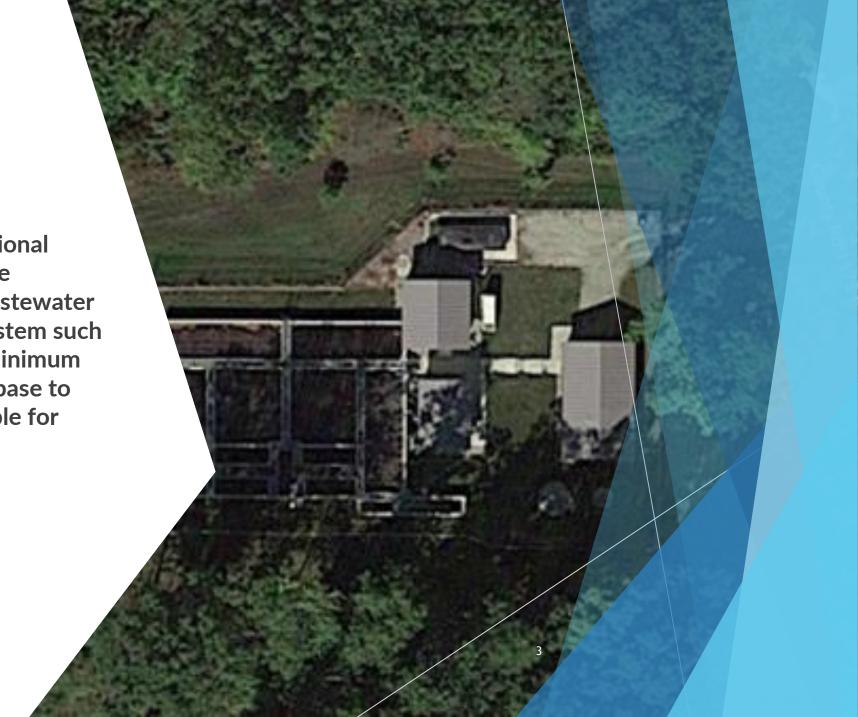
- Formed in 2009
- Infrastructure started in 2011 and operational in 2012
- System Cost: \$10,200,000
 - > \$4.6M grant from USDA Rural Development
 - \$5.6M loan (repaid in 2050)
- Seven-member board both Starke & Marshall county representatives
- Annual operating budget:
 - Revenues: \$732,000
 - Expenses: \$641,974
- Current cash reserve: \$1M
- Partners
 - ▶ Jones, Petrie & Rafiniski (engineer & billing)
 - Astbury (operator)

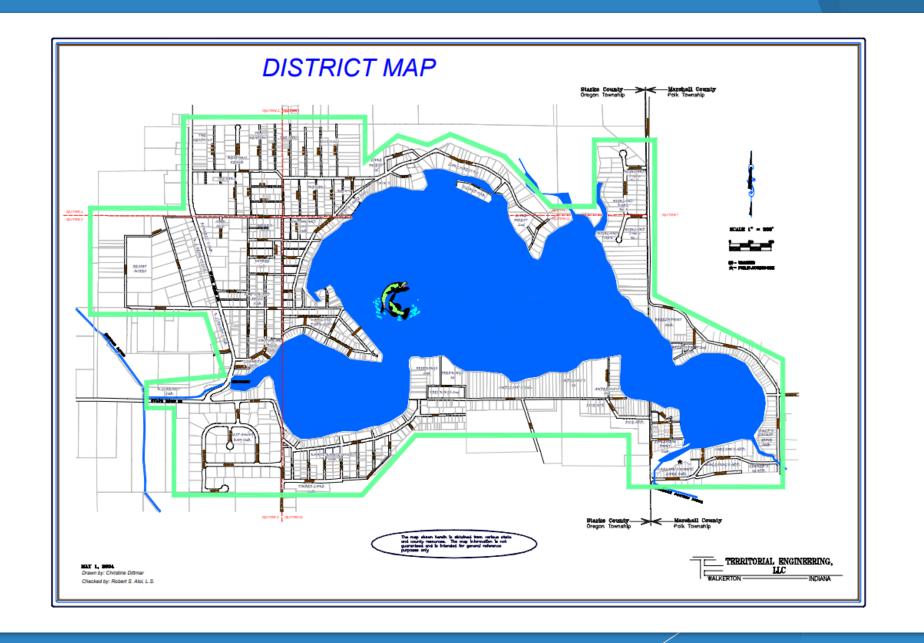




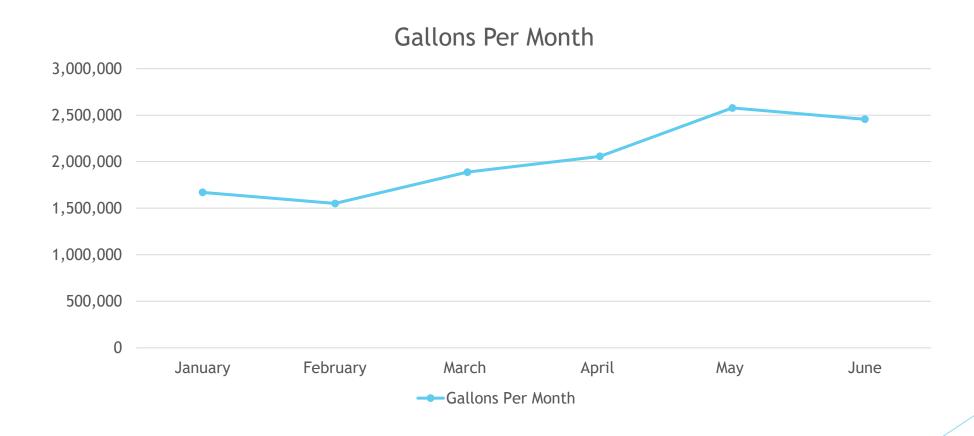
Mission Statement

CPI Inflation (2012-2022)

2.58% per year or **\$71.01** today

Rate Adjustment

- Rate per EDU
 - > \$55.02 to \$60 per month
- Inspection Fees
 - > \$90 to \$100
- Insufficient funds
 - > \$25 per occurrence
- ► Effective January 1, 2023

Operating Needs

- JPR Study (2022)
 - > \$1,225,000 suggested repairs/enhancements
 - ▶ Influent mechanical bar screen & concrete
 - Second sludge dewatering pad
 - Dewatering sump station improvements
 - UV disinfection system
 - Construction costs: \$978,000
 - Non-construction costs: \$247,500
- Grinder stations
 - ▶ 50 new units ordered earlier this year
 - > 238 of 511 have been replaced once (53% are original)
 - > \$2,384 each (in 50+ quantity) or \$3,357 each
 - ▶ Total expense: \$750,000+
